

Over 200,000 new local councilors elected on 25 October, 2015

THE NEED

On 25 October, 2015 local election for **over 200,000 mandates** takes place in Ukraine, completing the replacement of Yanukovich-era structures with the influx of thousands of newcomers to political life. Combined with a decentralization process that brings a new operational framework to the councils, the task is a serious challenge. However, this is a window of opportunity to support a bottom-up effort for building a new country firmly set on a European course.



STRONG LOCAL CAPACITY

The Institute of Political Education (IPO) has been a partner of RSI for many years. IPO was founded in 2001 with the mission of political education of Ukrainian society, including the development of parliamentary democracy and local self-governance, European integration of Ukraine and the promotion of Christian democratic values.



Since the independence of the country six democratic local elections were held in Ukraine, electing tens of thousands of councilors. In each election more than half of the local councilors were newly elected, many of them with low-level of political education, especially in matters related to local government. This compli-

cates the solution of local problems, prevents the strengthening of democratic processes, even generating revanchist sentiments for the return of the old Communist administrative systems. Through the cooperation of IPO and RSI many local councilors acquired knowledge that allowed them to effectively solve the problems of their communities. Ukraine has stepped on the road of decentralization, implements the principle of subsidiarity, and the successful European experience of reforms is necessary for the Ukrainian councilors.
