CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

HOW EUROPE WORKS:

A FIRST-HAND PERSPECTIVE ON EUROPEAN INSTITUTIONS MONTENEGRO

We are pleased to inform you that the Robert Schuman Institute (RSI), with the support of the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung Montenegro Office (KAS), Political Academy of the Austrian People's Party (POLAK) and the Wilfred Martens Centre for European Studies (WMCES) organises an introductory seminar (11 – 14 September, Montenegro) and a study visit (15 - 18 October, Brussels) under the title ***“How Europe Works: A First-Hand Perspective on EU Institutions”***. The series of two events will be provided for the same group of 12 people with relevant duties / functions in EPP affiliated parties in Montenegro.

Aims of the project:

- To support the EU-oriented work of EPP sister parties in an accession country by capacity building
- To familiarize participants with the basic values of the EPP as expressed in the new party platform, including their consequences and implications for particular policies
- To present the specific perspective of the EPP family, including the work at EPP Headquarters, WMCES
- To provide practical and ready-to-use knowledge on the development, structure and functions of the European Union and related institutions via interactive presentations, as well as practical and realistic information on EU membership criteria
- To give participants first-hand information and good insight into the everyday life of the EU when visiting the institutions on site during a Brussels field trip (e.g. European Parliament, Commission, Council, Committee of the Regions)
- To establish a professional network of pro-European young people from Montenegro

Target group: 12 public career-oriented people between 20 – 35 years of age, actively involved in EU-related work in EPP sister parties, will be selected on the basis of individual applications recommended by relevant parties.

Working days:

11 - 14 September (Tuesday-Friday) in Montenegro
arrival: 10 September, departure 14 September after 14h
15 - 18 October (Monday-Thursday) in Brussels
arrival: 14 October, departure 19 October

full attendance is necessary.

Working language: English (no interpretation will be provided)

Speakers:

- KAS, POLAK, WMCES staff and experts
- high-ranking EPP and EPP Group politicians, advisors and officials from the EU institutions
- representatives of EPP associations
- representatives of partner institutes and foundations
- officials and experts of other Brussels institutions

Proposed agenda for the Montenegro seminar, hosted by KAS:

- The idea of Europe, the Christian Democratic value basis of European integration
- Analysis of the institutional development of the EU
- Achievements and current challenges of integration
- Structure, functions and powers of the EU institutions
- Decision-making mechanisms in the EU
- The foreign and security policy architecture in Europe
- EU accession criteria, the perspective of EP elections and the next MFF (Accession) experiences of latest Member States
- International activities of an EPP party
- The role of national parliaments
- Information research regarding European cooperation
- Networking

Proposed agenda for the Brussels visit, hosted by WMCES:

- **EPP:** introduction to organisation, functions, current agenda and coordinating positions inside the political family, EPP values and their implementation to policy
- **KAS, WMCES:** work of a political think tank, contribution to policy making
- Introducing official EPP **associations**
- **Parliament:** organisation, working procedures, decision making process, the EPP Group, frameworks and current issues in relations with SEE countries
- **Commission:** preparing and working with common policies, communicating Europe
- **Council:** decision making, SEE enlargement procedure
- **Committee of the Regions:** EPP Group, subsidiarity in practice, municipal cooperation
- Accession country experience of working with EU institutions
- Working with EU information, media relations in Brussels
- Lobbying in the environment of EU institutions

Pre-requisites of participation:

- Demonstrated connection with the international / EU oriented activities of a party
- High level written and oral proficiency in English
- Applicants born between 1983-1998
- University/college degree (or at least four successfully completed semesters at university)
- Complete application package including form, official party reference letter, motivation of participation

For completing the form applicants should attach **letter of reference** from the delegating party (signed by a member of the national board / presidency (not the youth organization) or international secretary) and **copy of diploma** or a **certificate** issued by the university/college verifying that by the start of the course the applicant will be in 5th or higher semester of studies (in English)

Successful applicants must bring their original recommendation letter to the first course.
